The goal of the e-CODEX project is to:

"Improve the cross-border access of citizens and businesses to legal means in Europe as well as to improve the interoperability between legal authorities within the EU."

In a nutshell:

- Easy and secure access to legal information and procedures in other EU Member States for businesses and citizens
- Greater effectiveness and improved efficiency of cross-border judicial processes through common standards and greater interoperability of information systems

The project is structured into 7 work packages









The objective of the pilot Work Package is to demonstrate the value of the solutions developed by testing them in a real life environment.

- The real life cases will be called **pilots**. These will offer **true use cases** to be tested during 12 months
- Among others, the following areas will be explored:
 - Cross border claim procedures (Civil Justice)
 - Mutual Court Assistance (Civil Justice and Criminal Justice)
 - Interconnection of registers (Civil Justice and Criminal Justice)
